The Children's Health Policy Centre (CHPC) -- an interdisciplinary research group in the Faculty of Health Sciences at Simon Fraser University, downtown Vancouver campus -- is seeking a new Scientific Evaluation Director to manage a new \$5 million initiative.

The initiative relates to the Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP), a landmark targeted prevention program designed to improve the lives of vulnerable first-time mothers and their children. NFP was founded more than 30 years ago by Dr. David Olds and colleagues in the United States, but it has never been tested in Canada. The B.C. Government has asked the CHPC to lead the first Canadian scientific (randomized-controlled trial or RCT) evaluation of the NFP program in BC, in collaboration with McMaster University.

The new Director will lead a Scientific Evaluation team conducting the RCT and will report to Dr. Charlotte Waddell, Director of the CHPC. Dr. Waddell is Co-Principal Investigator for this project, together with Dr. Harriet MacMillan from McMaster University. Dr. Olds will consult on the RCT.

The preferred candidate must possess demonstrated experience running a successful RCT. An understanding of and/or interest in child health and development would be a distinct advantage. This person holds a PhD or equivalent in Health Sciences, Nursing or a related discipline. The Scientific Evaluation Director will be eligible for both a University Research Associate and an Adjunct Professor appointment at SFU, depending on qualifications.
